SCHOOL FEES

Port Alfred High School is a fee-paying school as per Government Gazette, November 1996, Act No. 84, 4.1.

"The governing body of a public school may, by process of law, enforce the payment of school fees by parents who are liable to pay."

PAYMENT OF THE ANNUAL SCHOOL FEES IS COMPULSORY. Port Alfred High School is a Quintile 5 school. This translates to slightly less than R150 per child per year and approximately 50% of the teaching staff salaries received from the Department of Education. Without school fee income, Port Alfred High School cannot function as a centre of educational excellence.

Payment is either by means of a monthly instalment beginning on or before 1 January and ending in October, or by means of the amount, in full, up-front. A discount is granted if the fees are paid in full for the year ahead by 31 January.

The Port Alfred High School Governing Body requires all parents who intend keeping their child/ ren at the school <u>for the following year</u>, to pay an amount of R2000 no later than 30 November of the preceding year.

This amount is then credited to your school account. Due to the large number of applicants received each year and limited classroom space, payment must be made on time to secure your child's place.

MENTORING PROGRAMME

Initiation is prohibited a Port Alfred High School.

An orientation and mentorship approach has been adopted in an effort to make every learners feel that they belong to the Port Alfred High family.

On arriving at the School, the Grade 8 learner will be introduced to a mentor who will be there to support and guide the learner throughout the year.

The aim is to provide the Grade 8 learner with an opportunity to settle into their high school journey. The mentor will meet with their mentee regularly during the term to discuss issues that their mentee may be having but most importantly, to develop a relationship with their mentee. The mentor will provide the necessary support, encouragement, empathy and direction. It is also their duty to introduce themselves to the mentee's parents and to provide them with a brief report of their mentee's progress.

CULTURE

Cultural activities are held in high regard at Port Alfred High School and every child is encouraged to pursue an activity that is enriching and rewarding. In the Senior Phase, learners can participate in a number of activities such as:

Debating

PAHS has an active debating society which participates in the Grahamstown League and attend the Provincial Competition annually. A number of our learners have represented the Eastern Cape Debating team. Our debating society also assist in cascading debating skills in our town and conduct regular training workshops.

Public Speaking

In addition to our annual PAHS FNB Public Speaking competition, we participate in the State of the Province Address (SOPA) public speaking competition held in Bhisho. Our learners have often been placed in the top 4 places in both the English (HL) and in the Afrikaans (HT and EAT) categories.

Interact

PAHS have a very engaged Interact committee and members are activity involved throughout the year with numerous community projects – Save the Rhino, and Project Roxy. The Interactors visit Damant Lodge and the SPCA regularly during the year.

SPORT

Sport at Port Alfred High is:

- Approached in a healthy and interactive manner in that our School does not subscribe to a "win at all costs" philosophy nor do we "poach talent".
- All about having fun while being physically active a healthy level of competitiveness is nurtured.
- Affordable in that **there** are no hidden tour costs.
- Encouraged from Grade 1 with swimming, tennis and hockey lessons being part of the "littlies" daily school programme.
- All-encompassing in that we actively encourage and acknowledge participation in sports that are beyond what we offer such as angling, horse-riding, surfing and gymnastics.
- **Compulsory** in that every learner is expected to participate in one summer and one winter sport.

The extra-mural sports programme will be sent home with our child within the first week.

Sport practices take place on campus and every child must please have their own clearly marked sports equipment

Matches are organised by the Sports Department and include both away and home fixtures. Busses are used to transport learners to other schools as far afield as East London, Grahamstown and Port Elizabeth. It is highly recommended that you download the D6 Communicator if your child is sporty so that you are notified of any changes in arrangements etc.



DISCIPLINE: SENIOR PHASE

The approach to discipline at Port Alfred High School is interactive and the constitutional rights of all are respected.

The senior phase has a 2 prong discipline system. The first involves MERITS issued to learners to reward good behavior (in its broadest sense). This can range from high marks to good manners and so on. The learners are issued with merit slips which they are required to carry with them, A member of staff asks them for their slips and awards merits. At various totals, badges are presented to the learners at an assembly.

When a learner breaks a minor rule, they are presented with a slip of paper to sign in which they acknowledge their wrongdoing. The information is entered into a computer where a record of all transgressions are kept. When a learner's total exceeds 3, another slip of paper is issued informing them that s/he is required to attend a detention period. This slip is to be taken home so that the parents are aware of the status and are required to sign it. The learner must then return the slip to the Grade Head.

When a learner wants to query their total for whatever reason, it is their right to do so. The school prints off the record and issues it to them and if an error has occurred, it is rectified immediately.

Please note that detention is compulsory.

CODE OF CONDUCT: please familiarize yourself with the Code of Conduct. It complies with the SA Schools Act. Read more about the Code of Conduct on the next page.

FORMAL ASSESSMENTS

These are part of the School Based Assessment which is compulsory for ALL SUBJECTS.

A learner may only rewrite a Controlled Test if a Doctor's certificate is provide. Only once this certificate has been accepted by the Head of Academics will the learner be permitted to rewrite the test.

Failure to produce a doctor's certificate will result in the learner forfeiting marks which can lead to failure.

HEALTH MATTERS

- * Please do not send sick children to school. The other children and staff are soon infected and this prevents us from having fun and giving our 100% to your child.
- * Please make head checks for lice part of your routine. Children with lice must please stay at home and be treated until the hair is clear.
- * Learners with ringwork, impetigo, chickenpox, measles, mumps or any other condition that is infectious will be sent home for treatment.

SAFETY IS EVERYONE'S RESPONSIBILITY

- * Please mark all your child's items with his/her name in big, clear writing remember bags, shoes, towels and costumes.
- * Please do not send any toys or other precious items to school. They may get lost or broken and the result is always TEARS! Should anything of this nature find its way to school, it will be taken away from your child and held in safe-keeping.
- * Port Alfred High School has a new perimeter fence with an access control pedestrian gate. Please help us to keep everyone safe by ensuring that the gate is always closed securely.
- * Security cameras as well as a limited number of lockers are installed on campus. Please enquire about securing a locker from your child's class teacher by means of a note in the homework book.
- * Please inform your child's teacher of any change in telephone and/or address details. We must have the correct information at hand in case of an emergency.

CODE OF CONDUCT

School rules in the form of the code of conduct have been drawn up for the benefit of all. The Code of Conduct has been compiled specifically to ensure that every child at Port Alfred High School is safe and happy.

Parental participation is essential. Any behaviour which disrupts the normal activities of the school is unacceptable. Teachers, learners and parents are responsible for developing a positive, co-operative, secure, non-violent school environment where individual rights are respected. The Port Alfred High School community celebrates its origin at a special Founders Day Assembly in August each year. On this special day, everyone takes the time to reflect on how far our town's oldest school has come since those early days of **1883**. The school then had an enrolment of about fifty boys and girls.

SCHOOL STRUCTURES & SUPPORT

THE PORT ALFRED HIGH SCHOOL GOVERNING BODY (SGB):

The School Governing Body is elected by the parent/guardian community every three years. It is recognised by the Department of Education as the official voice of the school and concerns itself with finance, human relations, grounds and buildings, marketing, alumni, development, strategic planning and legal compliance. It is also the ultimate authority in terms of disciplinary matters.

The SGB meets once a month and has several portfolio meetings throughout the term.

Matters of a purely educational nature are, however, dealt with by the Headmaster and his staff. Please raise concerns or queries with your child's teacher and/or the Head of Phase and/or Mr Nigel Adams who has an open door policy.

The SGB Chairperson is available via email in the event that you need to discuss matters that are not of an educational nature but are still related to the overall well-being of our school.

THE SCHOOL MANAGEMENT TEAM (SMT):

Chaired by the headmaster, Mr Nigel Adams (office@pahs.co.za) the SMT meets weekly and comprises the various heads of department as detailed under Contacts.

The SMT deals with the day to day operations of the school and is responsible for plans and projects necessary for educating children from creche to matric on one campus.
